## **Artistic Savagery in a Soul-Choked Land :**

Starting with the reading of Gene Weingarten's article *Pearls Before Breakfast* (cf. Washington Post, Sunday, April 8, 2007) on context, perception and priorities, the students were invited to share and reflect upon their relationship with art, their daily attitude and responsibility towards social, political and human life.

Respecting their desire to keep out from conditioned sensationalism, we have searched for the meaning of beauty and alive expression through events and artists who have become part of history because of their subversive coups d'état, coups de grace or artistic bravery.

Irremediably, the works of I. Stravinsky, Nijinsky, R. Barthes, F. G. Lorca, P.P. Pasolini, P. Bausch, Manolete, E. Morente, M. Marin, A. Rodriguez, ... were invoked.

Working on these materials with constant hunger has irremediably led the students to take a journey into the spanish *duende*- be it from a human being's point of view, or an artist's one.

This piece is inspired by the enduring drive, yearning duende, creative confusion and spiritual appetite of the members of the group with whom any director can only feel boiling stimulation to work.
